

Special Torah readings are added to our regular weekly readings in preparation for Passover.


Shabbat Zachor commands us to turn people away from evil, from mindless hate. It falls on the Shabbat before Purim, with its story of a man who hates without reason.

Shabbat Parah marks the beginning of the formal preparation for Pesach and we read a passage about rituals of purification involving a red heifer.



Rabbi's Desk

Rabbi Aaron Benson

The Holy Miser

Read the following folktale. Do any of us do what Shaiah the Miser did? Is it right to act as he acted? How might we apply the lesson of this story in our own lives? I'd love to hear your thoughts.

The richest man in Cracow had just died and nobody wanted to attend to his funeral preparations. He had always lived as an exile in his own city.

He never gave money to the poor. He had for years turned away every appeal for *tzedakah* that had come his way. He had consistently ignored his community for years. They called him Shaiah the Kamtzan, the miser. He had no children.

Before his death he had called the Burial Society, but they refused to bury him unless he gave them a certain amount that they could give to the poor. He refused. When he died, they just left his body alone in the house. Finally, after several days, a neighbor took pity on him and buried him at the edge of the graveyard, outside the wall.

Soon afterwards, the Rav of Cracow, R' Yom Tov Lipman Heller (1579-1654), started to notice a lack in community funds. Numerous poor families began coming to him for help. When called by the head of the charity committee, he learned that an unprecedented number of families were looking for funds to meet *Shabbas* expenses.

R' Yom Tov Lipman began to investigate. As he questioned each petitioner, a pattern emerged – an envelope! Each one had the same story. Every Friday morning there was an envelope that had been slipped underneath the front door, with just enough money inside to cover the week's expenses. How long had this been going on? Each one again told the same story. Shaiah the Kamtzan had been to see each of these people, interrogated them about their family size, needs etc., then scolded them never to dare beg from him again. Soon afterwards, the envelopes appeared.

R' Yom Tov Lipman was gripped with an uncontrollable trembling as he realized the stark truth, that nobody had ever known. Shaiah the Kamtzan had been supporting Cracow for years, secretly, not wanting to derive any honor or benefit from his mitzvot. In order to do that, he gave up friends, community, anything that resembled normal life.

R' Yom Tov Lipman called for all the residents of Cracow's Jewish community to assemble the next evening in the holiest of Cracow's synagogues, the Remah Shul. R' Yom Tov Lipman began to wail, "Shaiah, Shaiah, Holy Shaiah. How can we stand before your memory? How can we possibly beg your forgiveness?"

Then the Rav revealed to all the real story of Shaiah the Kamtzan. He requested in his last will and testament that be buried outside the graveyard, next to Shaiah. And he also had the headstone changed. On the grave of the miser it is now inscribed "Shaiah HaKamtzan HaKodesh," The Holy Miser.



Defensive Driving (DD) course responsibilities after over 20 years of organizing and seven years of teaching the course.

While offering this class here at NSJC will remain a Men's Club function, there is now an opportunity for any NSJC member, male or female, to become a licensed DD teacher.

Men's Club hosts this six-hour course, that is open to the community, once a month from September through June. If you wish to become a licensed defensive driving instructor and teach the course here at NSJC as a volunteer, Men's Club will pay for the licensing fee.

Upon becoming licensed, you will become an "agency" and receive a book with all the materials necessary for teaching the course. This will authorize you to teach defensive driving at other venues as well, such as libraries, businesses, etc., for which you will receive a fee.




"Out of Egypt..Into Modern Israeli Society" with guest speaker Gal Malka

Men's Club World Wide Wrap-Up

On February 2nd, the NSJC Men's Club sponsored the Federation of Jewish Men's Club World Wide *Tefillin* Wrap. *Shacharit* was led by Men's Club President Jerry Green. Joined by his *Zayin* students, Rabbi Aaron Benson gave a talk about *tefillin*. The service was followed by a bagel and lox breakfast. The program's guest speaker was Professor Samuel Levine, Director of the Jewish Law Institute and Professor of Law at Touro College. NSJC Men's Club member, Ray Cella, introduced the professor and spoke of our Men's Club's 29-year history of traveling to the grounds of the Jewish cemetery located next to the former state psychiatric hospital in Central Islip to recite *Kaddish* for the deceased residents of the facility who are buried there but have no one to remember them. Professor Levine spoke about his experience "discovering" the cemetery, what's been done to date and future plans to improve the cemetery grounds, and efforts being made to allow families of former patients to access their records.

Also *chametz* that tends to harden and adhere to inside surfaces of pans, pots, or cooking utensils, the utensils themselves, as well as pet food that contains *chametz* and mixtures thereof.

Rabbi Benson is also empowered to lease all places wherein the *chametz* owned by me may be found, particularly at the address/es listed below, and elsewhere.

Rabbi Benson has full right to appoint any agent or substitute in his stead and said substitute shall have full right to sell and lease as provided herein.

Rabbi Benson also has the full power and right to act as he deems fit and proper in accordance with all the details of the Bill of Sale used in the transaction to sell all my *chametz*, *chametz* mixtures, etc., as provided herein. This power is in conformity with all Torah, Rabbinic and Civil laws.


